Grant Update by Rachel: Applied in February noticed denied, then notice of award of OHA Tobacco Prevention. Applied 160,000 received 70,000. Full request was not awarded. This could possibly create a position from not until June- Awarded until June 2023. Possible secondary outcome is growing relationships with community partners to build stronger grant applications in the future.

These funds can be used to apply systemic and social determinants of health work around prevention.

Phoenix school is in the middle of a restructure working with workforce development and youth corp. Vision of youth corp could be a health corp where youth are trained to be community health workers.

Is there a way to get Cow Creek back to the table; their perspective is vital to the work being done?

Thrive has received a similar grant and is moving forward to hire someone and push out supports through their school committee.
